For the First Time ABOP Opens Masterclasses, a Repertoire Reading Session, and the ABOP Recital to the Public Free for Attendees

Los Angeles, CA (April 29, 2024)—The **Alliance of Black Orchestral Percussionists** (ABOP) is proud to announce its upcoming, week-long intensive program, *ABOP-in-LA* for ABOP Protégés. Scheduled for **May 26-May 31**, this immersive experience features a series of workshops, masterclasses, field trips, and a repertoire reading session, culminating in a final celebratory ABOP Recital.

ABOP aims to provide percussionists of African descent with an unparalleled opportunity for growth, networking, and artistic exploration.

Raynor Carroll, one of the seven founders of ABOP, shares the mission behind the development of the organization and their growing mentorship program. "After 33 years with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and noting the lack of diversity in symphonic orchestras across the country, as well as in conservatories, university music departments, and training orchestras, it was time to provide a structured path for young Black percussionists eager for a career in symphonic orchestras," said Carroll. "ABOP's mentorship program was created to support and guide young and emerging Black symphonic percussionists to realize their potential, while also boosting national

percussion audition rosters with exceptional Black candidates who are prepared, well-trained, and strong contenders for any orchestral position across America."

ABOP-in-LA participants have the chance to learn from esteemed instructors, collaborate with fellow musicians, and engage in meaningful discussions about the future of percussion in orchestral settings.

Highlights of the program include:

- Workshops: Led by industry experts, workshops cover a wide range of topics including technique development, repertoire exploration, and career advancement strategies.
- Masterclasses: Renowned percussionists will offer personalized instruction and feedback to participants, helping them refine their skills and broaden their musical horizons.
- **Repertoire Reading Session:** ABOP Protégés will play and rehearse standard audition percussion repertoire with a live orchestra.
- ABOP Recital: The week culminates in a dynamic performance featuring ABOP Protégés showcasing their talents.

While ABOP-in-LA is primarily curated for ABOP's Protégés, four masterclasses, the repertoire reading session and the ABOP Recital are open to aspiring percussionists of all levels, from students to percussion instructors.

"We look forward to *ABOP-in-LA* every year," says Carroll. "It's a week where our Protégés receive intensive hands-on training with master teachers and industry experts, meet like-minded peers, share experiences, and become energized for the challenges ahead. We also look forward to welcoming the public and future ABOP Protégés to the open events we are hosting throughout this year's *ABOP-in-LA*. This week is an opportunity for the ABOP family of Protégés, Mentors, Board Members, Advisors, and supporters to come together to celebrate and renew the commitment we're making to change the face of concert stages nationwide."

About ABOP Protégés

ABOP Protégés are members of ABOP's Mentorship Program, open to Black percussionists of any age seeking training and support in pursuing a career in orchestral percussion. Students, pre-professionals, and professionals are prepared and guided to the next step in their musical careers by qualified and experienced percussionists in the field (ABOP Mentors). Program benefits are provided at no cost to Protégés.

Protégés are accepted each year on a rolling basis, pending program funding. Based on the Protégé's skills upon entry, Mentors work with Protégés over time to develop the skills and focus required of

professional players. ABOP will work with the Protégés' current musical activities to complement and enhance their development. Protégés will be encouraged not only to learn, but to teach and mentor. The aim is to cumulatively grow a professionally trained cohort of Black musicians who can support each other and nurture newcomers.

An important focus of the ABOP Mentorship is to develop the whole person—not just a skilled musician, but a compassionate, well-rounded, and responsible individual, prepared for today's tasks and tomorrow's challenges.
